1. Meeting opened at 2:30PM
2. Introductions, Agency Status (during COVID-19 stay at home order), how populations have been affected, re-opening plans/dates.
 - a. Lisa DiSabato-Moore (Summit County Juvenile Court): Juvenile Court continues with Zoom and phone hearings. Received some Ohio Supreme Court funding to implement Zoom technology and Plexiglas barriers. Practices include temperature checks, masks are mandated and video visitation for those in detention.
 - b. Representative Tavia Galonski (Ohio House): State of Ohio legislation has been in session for the prior three weeks. Statehouse is open to the public. By rule, it is needed to have in-person meetings. Representative Galonski mentioned she has been spending quite a bit of time helping constituents access and navigate the unemployment process.
 - c. Chief Jack Davis (Cuyahoga Falls Police): Police department still working. Keeping all people employed. Applied for QRT grant to provide response for the next year. Police have been twice as busy since the stay-at-home order has been lifted and things are reopening. Increase in number of suicides and DOAs. Overdoses numbers are about the same.
 - d. Rhonda Brink (Summit County Adult Probation): Turning point has been using telephone contact and hearing by Zoom.
 - e. Kim Patton (County of Summit ADM Board): Behavioral health services are open and the ADM has been utilizing some digital media campaigns to make sure Summit County residents are aware that treatment and mental health services are continuing and open of new intakes. There have been a decrease in numbers of calls to the ADM Helpline but in increase in acuity of those calls (Average call used to take 10 minutes and now it's 20-30 minutes). Peer support has really stepped up during COVID-19. Probate court resumed in person services last week and QRT in Stow starts up May 27th. Summit County Public Health has been providing mail service for distributing naloxone.

- f. Lori Pesci (Summit County Public Safety): Lots of collaborative work with Summit County Public Health to address proper county re-opening efforts. The Opioid Settlement funds have been received and an advisory council is being set up to insure responsibility and transparency in the disbursement of funds.
 - g. Emily Beers (Oriana House, Inc.): March and April services were conducted by telephone support. Drug screens have been stopped. Aware that people in recovery need contact for support and that has been difficult during the stay-at-home order. Keep in contact with participants by providing email resources and support. Drug screens will be opening up next week on a limited scope pilot program.

 - b. Possible Goals:
 - i. Ohio Legislative Criminal Justice Reform Committee partners with the Summit County Opiate & Addiction Task Force to provide regular updates on bills and criminal justice information updates.
 - ii. Improve the continuum of care of inmates from the jail as they transition back into the community
 - iii. Reduce stigma and bias in law enforcement
 - iv. Get Detera bags included in personal property as inmates are released from jail.
